CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP (open to all league members)
SENIOR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP (must be 72 by 12/31/25)
LEGENDS CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP (must be 80 by 12/31/25)

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

FORMAT:

Club Championship and Senior Club Championship are each 54-hole gross individual stroke play tournaments that will be run concurrently. The Legends Club Championship is a 36-hole gross individual stroke play tournament. Players must indicate on the signup sheet which championship they are competing for. A player is eligible to play in any championship for which she meets the age criteria. There is no age restriction for those wishing to compete for the Club Championship.

MINIMUM SIGNUPS:

A minimum of 10 players must sign up for the Club Championship and Senior Club Championship. A minimum of 8 players must sign up for the Legends Club Championship. If less than the minimum required number of players sign up for a championship, no champion will be crowned for it and those players will have the option to play for another championship for which they meet the age requirement.

COURSES / TEES:

March 11 - C/S; March 13 - T/C; March 18 - S/T for Club Championship and Senior Club Championship. March 11 - C/S and March 18 - S/T for Legends Championship. March 15 is reserved for weather cancellations. Club Championship and Senior Club Championship players will play from special Tournament Tees designated by White Bricks and Roses. Legends Club Championship players will play from the Red Tees.

DEADLINE: Sign up ends at 2 PM Wednesday, March 5th.

FLIGHTING: Flights will be by handicap index within each championship.

PAIRINGS:

Flights and first round will be based on March 8th handicap index. The Tournament Committee will determine tee times and pairings for the following rounds according to cumulative gross score totals within each championship based upon the completed rounds.

AWARDS:

Club Champion, Senior Club Champion and Legends Club Champion will be the player in each event with the lowest gross score. Flight prizes will be awarded in all flights of Club, Senior Club and Legends Club Championships dependent upon number of players.

SCORECARDS:

Players should check-in at least **20 minutes** before their tee times at the <u>registration</u> table near the Pro Shop. If starting on **CATALINA**, check in is at the Catalina putting green. There will be an individual scorecard per player. Each player should exchange scorecards with another competitor in her group. There will be a scoring table in an area near the Pro Shop. Each player **must** go to that area upon completion of each round. The scorecards must be signed by both the player and the marker to be official. If there are any rules questions, the player should have those questions answered <u>before</u> signing and placing her scorecard in the official scorecard box. Once placed in the box, no changes may be made to the card. DO NOT POST YOUR ROUND.

TIES:

In case of a tie for the Club Championship, Senior Club Championship and/or Legends Club Championship, a sudden death playoff will be played immediately. The starting hole will be determined by the Golf Professional.

Ties among <u>flight</u> competitors will be broken by matching cards per USGA recommended Card-Off Procedure.

RULES:

Players must complete all scheduled rounds per the SBWGA-18 Standing Rules for Major Tournaments. For any EMERGENCY withdrawals, the player shall contact the Tournament Chairs. Players must be prepared to play at their assigned times, subject to disqualification (Rule 5.3a). If the Tournament Committee deems it necessary to end the tournament before completion, e.g., because of weather, the leaders at that point will be declared the winners and the decision of the Committee will be final. In any event, the Committee will assure that all players will have played an equal number of holes.

R&A/USGA Rules for Stroke Play are in effect as modified by the SaddleBrooke One Golf Local Rules and SBWGA-18 Standing Rules*, with the following exception:

1) <u>Stroke and Distance.</u> The Local Rule Alternative for stroke-and-distance for a ball which is lost or out- of-bounds will **NOT** be used for this tournament.

*SBWGA Standing Rules Section VII – SBWGA-18 Local Rule:

For all SBWGA-18 league play, SaddleBrooke Course Hole #2 will be governed by:

- 1. The R&A/USGA Rules of Golf, Rule #17 Penalty Areas.
- 2. SBWGA-18 Local Rule: No player may take a gross score higher than nine (9) on SaddleBrooke Course, Hole #2. There is one drop zone on this hole. When a player reaches a gross score of nine (9), it is mandatory that they pick up their ball and record a gross score of nine (9). This will not disqualify a player from any tournament, ACE Day or any games played on Tuesday Play Day.
- 3. SaddleBrooke One Golf Local Rule: Decorative Rock (as indicated on the back of the scorecard). Players must take free relief under R&A/USGA Rule 16.1.

All disputes must be presented to a rules committee person BEFORE signing your scorecard or you will be disqualified. If there is a dispute while playing, you may apply the two ball rule, Rule 20.1c (3).
