

CALIFORNIA SCRAMBLE

(The Strategic Scramble)

Each team is made up of an A, B, C, and D player.

Only on the first hole, all golfers tee off. They then pick the drive they want to use, and all players bring their ball to that spot, as in a scramble. The person whose drive is chosen does not hit the second shot.

The other 3 players then hit their second shots, and the team chooses which ONE of those three you are going to use. The player whose ball is used for the second shot does not hit the third shot, but the first player comes back in. You should always have 3 players hitting until the ball is holed out. Whoever makes the putt does not tee off on the next hole.

The challenge is that this requires some strategic planning - you want to be thinking a shot ahead. You may not want your longest hitter to make the putt on the hole before, although that may happen if the other two miss it. You may not want to pick your best chipper's shot if the next shot is a chip. You may want to keep your 'A' player available for the second long shot off the fairway. It's all about strategy when choosing the shot to use!

Since you are playing with ladies you may not have played with before, you may want to discuss what each person feels is the strongest part of her game so you know which player is going to give you the best chance on each shot.

Only gross team scores will be used to determine winners; however, when each team is put together we will do our best to keep the combined team handicaps as even as possible.

The **MOST IMPORTANT** part is for everyone who signs up to show up - this will not be an easy scramble to move people around on game day. Don't forget to have **FUN, FUN, FUN!**

RULES FOR PLACING BALL

On the fairway or in the rough, all balls must be played WITHIN one club length from the ball that is selected, no closer to the hole. However, all balls must remain in the same lie of the shot that is selected. For example, if the selected ball lies in the rough, all balls must be played from the rough.

On the green, all balls must be played from WITHIN one club head from the ball that is selected, no closer to the hole. However, all balls must remain on the green and cannot be moved off the green.

CLOSEST TO THE HOLE WILL BE THE ONLY CONTEST!!!

On the closest to the hole(s), all players will attempt the shot.
